



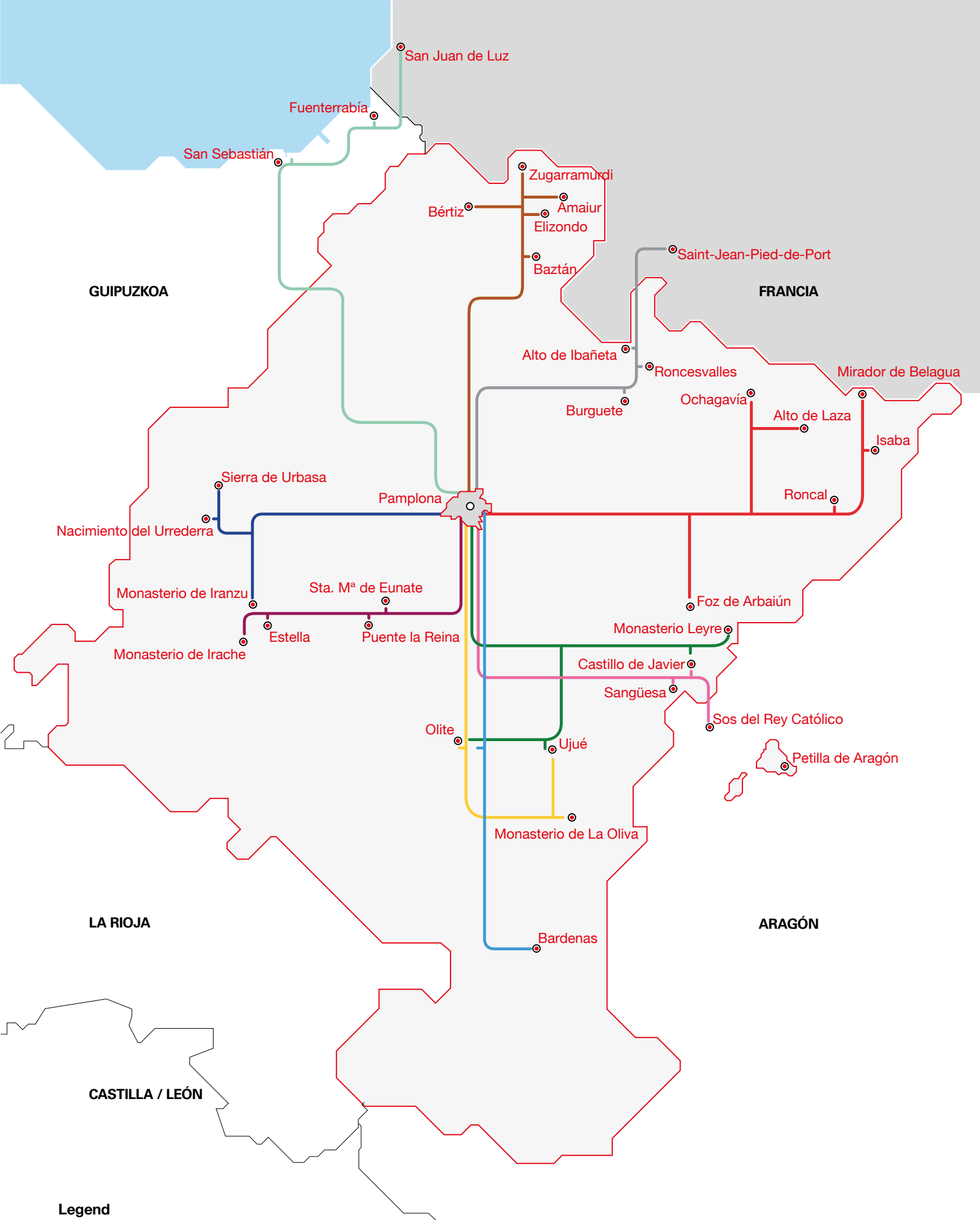

Guided Tour of Pamplona

Half Day

Pamplona, the capital of Navarra, is a city with a unique identity that combines history, tradition and modern life. Our guided tours offer a complete and enjoyable experience.

Throughout the itinerary, official guides introduce the city from all its perspectives.

We start with the spirit of San Fermín, Pamplona's international symbol, reliving the emotions of the festivities and the route of the Running of the Bulls through its most emblematic streets.

We embark on a journey into the past, exploring medieval Pamplona and its role in the Way of St. James, a central pillar of culture and spirituality in northern Spain.

We connect with its valuable historical and religious heritage, its cobbled streets and its remarkable churches such as the Cathedral of Santa María or San Saturnino.

We also devote a section to the city's military past and defensive system, as we walk along the Renaissance walls and bastions that made Pamplona an exemplary fortified stronghold.

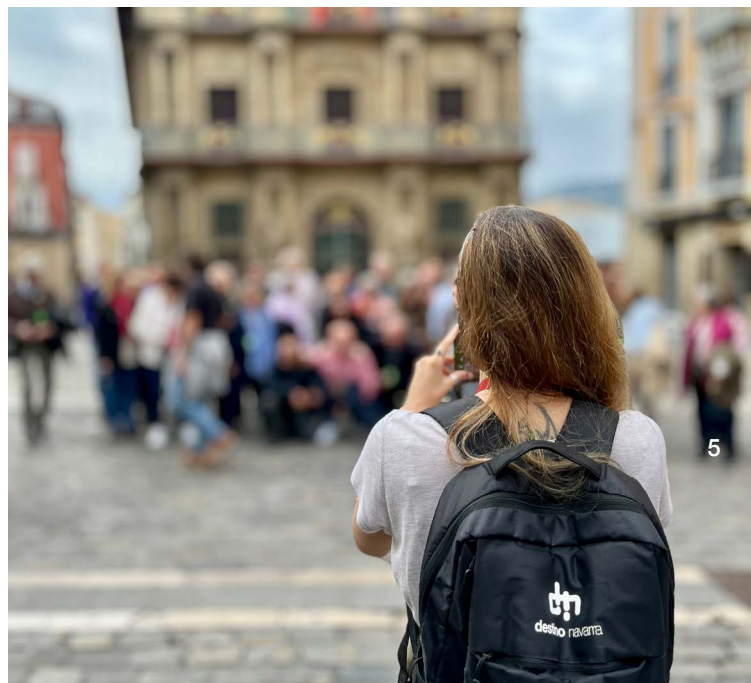
The tour concludes with a closer look at gastronomy, traditions and the Pamplona way of life, discovering flavours and traditions that are part of its identity.

During the visit we include emblematic points such as the Monument to the Running of the Bulls, the Bullring, Estafeta Street, the Cathedral of Santa María, the City Walls, the Town Hall, the Church of San Saturnino and Plaza del Castillo, among others.

We offer visits adjusted to different group profiles, with flexible schedules and the opportunity of customisation according to the client's interests.

Our aim is for every visitor to leave with a complete, dynamic and authentic view of Pamplona.

The Baztán Route

Full Day

The Baztán Route offers a full-day excursion through one of the most distinctive valleys in northern Navarra, where history, Basque culture and legends combine in a setting of great beauty.

The excursion begins departing from Pamplona early in the morning. During the journey, we will provide a general introduction to the valley, its geographical and cultural context, and the plan for the day.

Amaiur: historical symbol of the valley

Amaiur is one of the places with the greatest symbolic significance in Baztán. The village, presided over by the monolith that commemorates the resistance of the Castle in the

16th century, offers a pleasant walk among traditionally built houses in a highly photogenic environment.

Zugarramurdi and its caves

Zugarramurdi is well-known for its famous caves related to witchcraft trials in the 17th century. The visit allows you to discover this unique natural site and to approach the historical episodes that gave rise to the legend of the akelarres (witches' gatherings),

which are now understood from a historical and cultural perspective.

Elizondo

Next, the route heads to Elizondo, the capital and main urban centre of the Baztán Valley. A walk through the old town allows you to admire its Basque-style manor houses and the elegant "Indiano" palaces, built by emigrants who returned from America.

In the afternoon, the excursion continues to the **Bertiz Natural Park**, a protected area of great landscape value.

The visit focuses on its botanical garden, which brings together a varied collection of tree and bush species in a carefully maintained setting, with paths, ornamental features and buildings of interest, in an atmosphere of great tranquility.

Return to Pamplona



The Pyrenees Route

Full Day

This excursion brings us closer to emblematic and authentic Pyrenean landscapes. The programme combines heritage, nature and traditional culture.

Departure from Pamplona

We visit the Roncal and Salazar valleys, located in the far northeastern sector of Navarra, where extensive forests of great beauty have been preserved.

The villages stand out for their stone houses and steeply sloping roofs, reflecting the traditional architecture.

Roncal and the Belagua viewpoint

The day begins with a visit to Roncal, the geographical centre of the valley and birthplace of the tenor Julián Gayarre, whose mausoleum is one of its main points of interest. After a walk through the town centre, we head towards Belagua, from where you can contemplate imposing Pyrenean peaks and forests that cover the hills, offering a spectacular landscape.

Isaba

Next, the group travels to Isaba, the most populated municipality in the valley, located in a privileged setting at the confluence of the Belagua and Uztároz rivers.

It is a mountain environment, with stone houses of a distinctive Pyrenean character.

Lazar Pass and Ochagavía

The itinerary continues via the Lazar Pass, one of the most representative passes between the Roncal and Salazar valleys, offering a wide panorama of the Pyrenees.

We then visit Ochagavía, considered one of the most picturesque villages in Navarra, with cobbled streets, stone farmhouses and several bridges that cross the rivers running through it.

Arbayún Gorge

The excursion concludes at the Arbayún Gorge, an impressive canyon carved by the Salazar River. From the viewpoint, you can appreciate the verticality of its walls and the richness of its vegetation, with a great presence of birds of prey that inhabit this protected environment.

Return to Pamplona



The Medieval Route

Full Day

The Medieval Route proposes a cultural day trip through some of the most outstanding historic complexes of the former Kingdom of Navarra. The itinerary includes monasteries, fortified towns and royal residences, with departure from and return to Pamplona.

Monastery of La Oliva

After leaving Pamplona, the first stop is the Cistercian Monastery of La Oliva, founded in the 12th century and considered one of the most significant in the kingdom for its architecture and historical past.

The visit allows you to discover its church, with Romanesque and Gothic elements, and its extraordinary 14th-century Gothic cloister, one of the most significant monastic ensembles in Navarra.

Ujué, fortress and sanctuary

The route continues to Ujué, a medieval town built on top of a hill that served defensive functions against Muslims and the Kingdom of Aragon. At its highest point stands the fortress-church of Santa María, which combines Romanesque and Gothic elements, surrounded by wall-walks and crenellated towers, and which houses a famous Romanesque image of the Virgin as well as the heart of Charles II of Navarre.

Olite

At midday, the group moves to Olite, former seat of the Navarrese court, where a medieval urban layout of narrow streets and a notable religious ensemble are preserved.

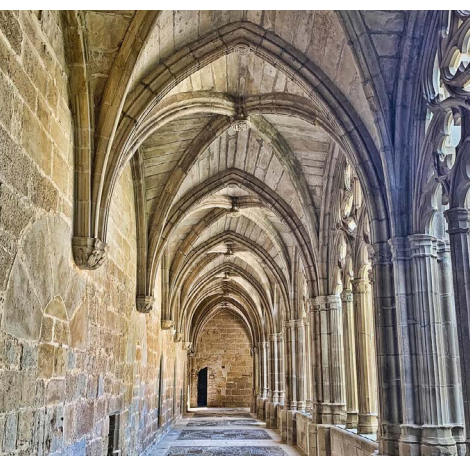
The visit includes the churches of Santa María la Real, known for its richly decorated Gothic portal, and San Pedro, containing a Romanesque cloister and a distinctive Gothic tower.

Royal Palace visit

Next, we visit the palace-castle of Olite, one of the symbols of medieval Navarra, expanded in the time of Charles III “the Noble”.

The complex, with its towers, walls, rooms and gardens, presents a monumental image that evokes the court life of the Middle Ages.

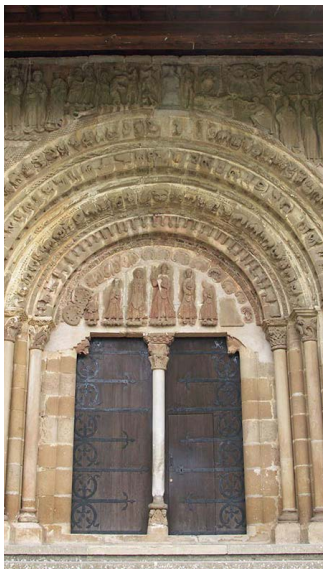
Royal Route

Full Day

The Royal Route leads us through the most outstanding landmarks of the royal seats of the old Kingdom of Navarre, across Mediterranean mountain ranges and landscapes rich in tradition.

Monastery of Leyre

The Monastery of Leyre is nestled on the mountainside in a stunning natural setting. It is one of the oldest and most important monastic complexes in Navarre. A former royal pantheon and a major spiritual and political centre in the Middle Ages, it preserves architectural elements from the 11th to the 14th centuries, among which the impressive Romanesque crypt and the famous Porta Speciosa stand out.



Javier Castle

At Javier Castle, we will learn the history of the building and Saint Francis Xavier, the patron saint of Navarre.

The complex, originally centered on a medieval tower and restored at the end of the 19th century, offers an interesting visit combining history, devotion and defensive architecture.



Ujué, fortress and sanctuary

At the highest point of Ujué stands the fortress-church of Santa María, which combines Romanesque and Gothic features. It is surrounded by wall-walks and crenellated towers, and houses a famous Romanesque image of the Virgin as well as the heart of Charles II of Navarre.

Olite

Olite was the seat of the Navarrese court. During the visit, we will discover the medieval town with the churches of Santa María la Real (holding a richly decorated Gothic portal) and San Pedro with its astonishing Gothic tower.

Royal Palace visit

Next, we visit the palace-castle of Olite, one of the symbols of medieval Navarre, expanded in the time of Charles III "the Noble".

The complex, with its towers, walls, rooms and gardens, offers a monumental image that evokes the court life of the Middle Ages.

The way of St. James-Aragonese Route

Full Day

The Way of St. James route via the Aragonese Way proposes a cultural day trip that visits some of the most significant historic sites in eastern Navarre and neighbouring Aragon.

It is an itinerary that combines Romanesque art, Jacobean spirituality and medieval landscapes.

Monastery of Leyre

After leaving Pamplona, the first stop is the Monastery of Leyre, one of the oldest and most important monastic complexes in Navarre. A former royal pantheon and a major spiritual and political centre in the Middle Ages, it preserves architectural elements from the 11th to the 14th centuries, among which the impressive Romanesque crypt and the famous Porta Speciosa stand out.

Sangüesa, a Jacobean town

The route continues to Sangüesa, a town on the banks of the River Aragón and a key point on the Way of St. James via the Aragonese Way. The urban walk includes the Church of Santa María, with one of the most notable Romanesque portals in the Iberian Peninsula, as well as the Palace of the Prince of Viana, a former royal residence that reflects the town's historical importance.

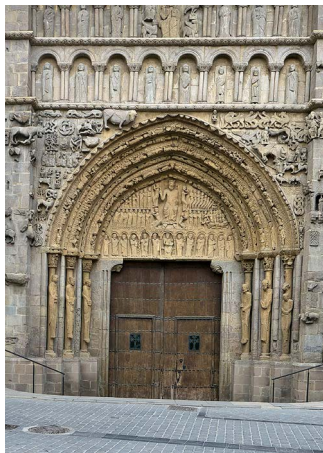
Javier Castle

At midday, the group heads to Javier Castle, birthplace of Saint Francis Xavier, patron saint of missions. The complex, originally centered on a medieval tower and restored at the end of the 19th century, offers an interesting visit combining history, devotion and defensive architecture.

Sos del Rey Católico

In the afternoon, the itinerary enters Aragon to visit Sos del Rey Católico, one of the best-preserved medieval towns in the area. Its stone houses, narrow streets, castle and Romanesque church form a harmonious urban ensemble that allows visitors to immerse themselves in an authentic medieval atmosphere.

Return to Pamplona



The way of St. James-Navarrese Route

Full Day

The Navarrese Route of the Way of St. James combines landscape, history and Jacobean spirituality in a single day.

It is an ideal proposal for groups who wish to learn about the key places of the Camino in Navarre.

We leave Pamplona heading towards the Pyrenees, following the historic Jacobean route. Throughout the day, we visit emblematic sites that have been stopping points for pilgrims for centuries.

Ibañeta Pass

Ibañeta Pass is a mountain pass full of historical symbolism, where legend places the famous “Battle of Roncesvalles”. From here you can enjoy a wide panorama of the surrounding mountains and valleys, which helps you understand the hardship and beauty of the Camino as it enters the Iberian Peninsula.

Saint-Jean-Pied-de-Port

Next, the route crosses the border to visit Saint-Jean-Pied-de-Port, the last town in Lower Navarre in France before the Camino enters Navarre.

Its walled old town, hilltop citadel, and views over the mountains create a charming ensemble, recognised as one of the most emblematic starting points of the Way of St. James.

Burguete

Returning to the southern side of the Pyrenees, the day continues in Burguete, a town traditionally linked to pilgrimage, organised around a main street lined with solid stone houses.

Roncesvalles

In the afternoon, the visit focuses on the Royal Collegiate Church of Roncesvalles, a milestone of the Way of St. James. The complex stands out for its French-influenced Gothic church and the cloister, containing the tomb of Sancho VII “the Strong”.

The visit helps to understand Roncesvalles’ historical role as the gateway to the Jacobean route in Spain.

Return to Pamplona



The Way of St. James Where the Routes Meet

Full Day

The “Where the Routes Meet” itinerary offers a full day visiting the most emblematic sites of the Way of St. James in Navarre, where the Aragonese and Navarrese routes converge.

The excursion combines Romanesque art, Jacobean history and wine tradition.

Departure from Pamplona

Santa María de Eunate

After leaving Pamplona, the first stop is the Church of Santa María de Eunate, an octagonal Romanesque church set in an open, flat landscape. Its location and architecture make it a landmark, notable for its artistic value and its legend.



Puente la Reina, crossroads

Next, we visit Puente la Reina, the crucial place where the Aragonese and Navarrese routes of the Way of St. James join. The town centre preserves two churches of great interest: the Church of the Crucifijo and the Church of Santiago el Mayor, with a Romanesque portal and a Baroque tower. Calle Mayor, lined with heraldic houses, ends at the historic medieval bridge built to facilitate pilgrims' crossing.

Estella

The day continues in Estella, a town founded by Sancho “the Great” and a meeting point for travellers since the 11th century.

The walk through the historic centre includes the Church of San Pedro, the Palace of the Kings, and the churches of San Miguel and Santo Sepulcro.

Wineries and the Monastery of Irache

In the afternoon, we visit the Monastery of Irache, a monumental complex with Romanesque, Renaissance and Baroque styles, with two cloisters and a 12th-century church.

Optionally, the day can be completed with a visit to a winery in the Tierra Estella area.

Tierra Estella and Urbasa

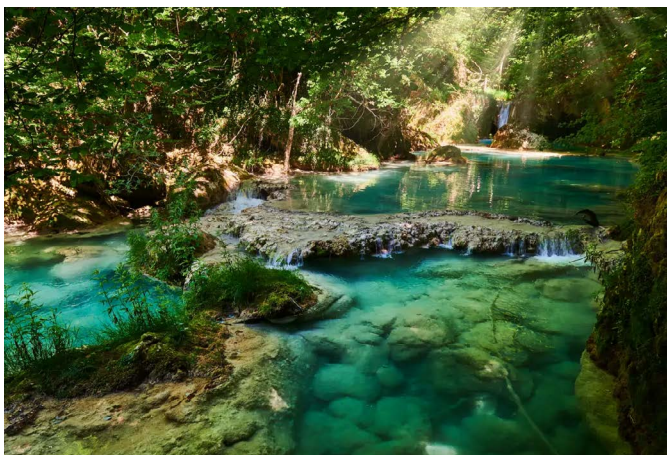
Full Day

This excursion combines historic heritage, protected nature and mountain landscapes in one of the most complete areas of Navarre, offering a varied and well-balanced day.

Urederra Spring

The excursion enters the Urederra River Spring area, one of Navarre's most emblematic natural sites. During the route, the geological, environmental and landscape value of the mountain range will be explained. We will have time to enjoy the surroundings, depending on the group's profile and the meteorological conditions of the day.

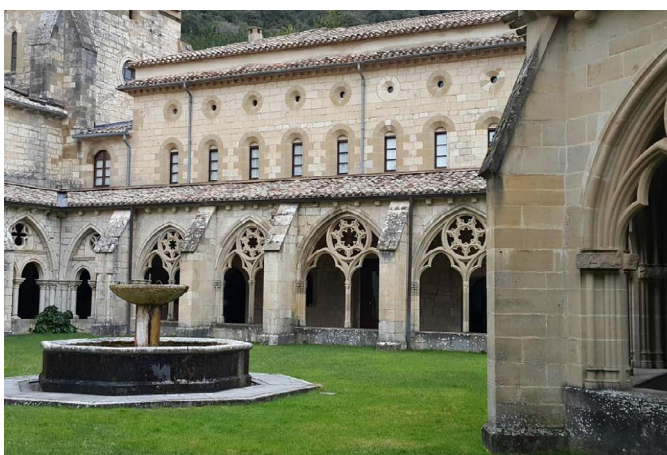
To reach the spring, participants need proper physical condition to complete a short rocky route of up to 6 km.



Monastery of Iranzu

Next, we travel to the Monastery of Iranzu, one of the most outstanding Cistercian monastic ensembles in Navarre.

The visit focuses on the Romanesque church and cloister, as well as the history of the monastery and its relationship with the surrounding area.



Urbasa and Andía Mountain Range

The day continues in the Urbasa and Andía Natural Park, a vast land of meadows and forests that is one of Navarre's great natural spaces.

During the visit, we interpret the karst landscape, the mountain's pastoral importance and its role as a natural border between the northern Mountain area and Navarra's southern Ribera.



Panoramic stops allow you to enjoy the views and understand the uniqueness of this protected space.

Return to Pamplona



Bardenas Reales and Olite

Full Day

The Bardenas Reales are a unique semi-desert landscape in Navarre, shaped by wind and water over thousands of years. Its rock formations and wide plains create an almost lunar environment, stunning and full of contrasts.

Along approximately 25 km of path, we visit the most emblematic sites. At each stop, we contemplate singular geological formations, canyons and endless horizons.

It is a landscape that invites slow contemplation, where the light changes constantly and enhances the colours that define the identity of the Bardenas. Our guides explain the remarkable geodiversity that creates a true lunar landscape,

the flora and fauna that have developed strategies to survive in an extreme environment, and the human uses (agricultural, livestock and cultural) that have coexisted with the territory for centuries and remain an essential part of its identity.

To deepen the experience, we propose short walks. Walking for a few minutes allows visitors to feel the texture of clays and sandstones, perceive the aromas of the vegetation and observe details that go unnoticed from the vehicle.

With an approximate duration of 3 hours, this coach tour is an ideal option for groups and travel agencies aiming to offer an accessible, enriching and deeply inspiring experience.

This morning excursion can be complemented in the afternoon with a visit to Olite.

Olite

Olite was the seat of the Navarrese court. During the visit, we will discover the medieval town with the churches of Santa María la Real (holding a richly decorated Gothic portal) and San Pedro with its astonishing Gothic tower.

Royal Palace visit

The Basque Coast

Full Day

The Basque Coast is a full-day proposal that combines history, scenery and tradition in a privileged setting beside the Cantabrian Sea.

The excursion visits three emblematic cities, departing and returning to Pamplona.

Saint-Jean-de-Luz (France)

The first stop is Saint-Jean-de-Luz, a town well-known for its typical houses and historic fishing harbour, which was significant for whale and cod fishing during the 9th and 10th centuries.

During the visit, the group walks along the defensive walls, the harbour and the historic centre, highlighting the place where King Louis XIV's wedding was celebrated in the 17th century.

Hondarribia (Fuenterrabía)

Next, the route continues to Hondarribia, a fortified town on a hill overlooking the mouth of the Bidasoa River.

Its old quarter, surrounded by 16th-century walls, preserves the Palace of Charles V, today a National Parador, and the Marina district, with its traditional fishermen's houses painted red and green.

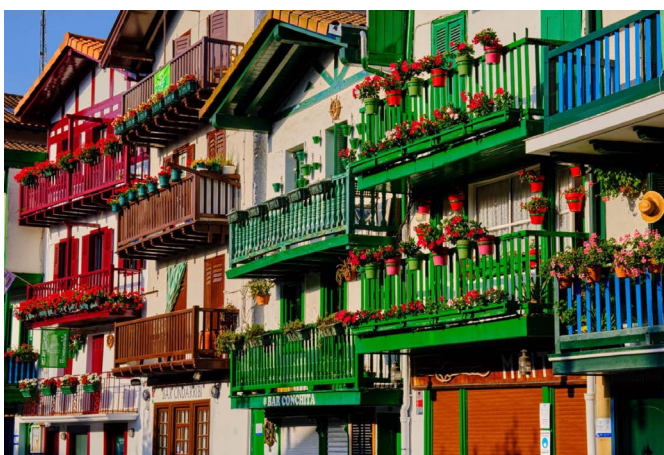
San Sebastián (Donostia)

In the afternoon, the group reaches San Sebastián, a city set on a bay and surrounded by hills.

The visit includes its emblematic beaches - La Concha, Ondarreta and Gros - , the old town, Alderdi Eder Gardens and Paseo Nuevo.

The day also includes a panoramic view from Mount Igeldo, with its amusement park and spectacular views over the city.

Return to Pamplona
